Our green spaces, parks and playground aren't luxuries- they're necessary to maintaining the health and quality of life in our community. On the Council I have brought tens of millions of dollars worth of resources to our local parks, including the Sunset Park Ballfields and Playground, Slope Park, Valentino Pier, Red Hook Park, and the new Sunset Park Waterfront Park.
